

Notice to diners.

When we were allowed to reopen in the summer of 2020, we made some changes to our operating procedures to reduce the risk of spreading coronavirus.

To minimise the number of paper menus being passed around and the times we go back and forth to each table, we began asking all diners to look at our menu before their visit and, if possible, pre-select their dinner choices. Because we had pre-orders, we were able to greatly increase the number of dishes we offered, and the menu is now much broader than it originally was.

Over the months we found that these changes had a few beneficial side effects. We are using much less paper because we are printing far fewer menus, but, most importantly, in our opinion, we are wasting a lot less food because our chef is buying and cooking only what is needed.

Although there are now less restrictions in place, we would still like to carry on with the positive changes and continue to offer the extended menu to our diners. If possible, we ask you to look at our menu and advise us of your food choices by the morning of your dinner reservation, including any special requests or dietary requirements. We know this is not always possible and it is by no means essential, but if you can, then it will be much appreciated. Many thanks for your custom.
